DENVER (January 24, 2018) – Snell & Wilmer is pleased to announce that Denver Counsel [Byeongsook Seo](#) has been appointed to the [Second Judicial District Nominating Commission](#). As a commissioner, Seo will serve a six-year term, interviewing and nominating applicants for judicial vacancies.

Since passing a constitutional amendment in 1966, the state of Colorado appoints judges through the Judicial District Nominating Commission. When a vacancy occurs in a county or district judgeship, the commission interviews applicants and comes to a recommendation. This recommendation then gets sent to Governor Hickenlooper for consideration and appointment.

In his legal practice, Seo applies his experiences to a broad range of subjects, representing individual clients as well as Fortune 500 companies in complex intellectual property and commercial matters.
